

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


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## PreK 1

We discovered there are many different types of houses around the world. We explored countries like Japan, Iran, Kenya, and Russia, to name a few. We learned that Inuit children in Greenland often live in "snow houses" that are on stilts. Children in Peru near the Amazon also live in houses on stilts, but not because of the snow! They need to protect themselves from the river and from the animals that live in the jungle. While we were learning about how other children live, we also learned about ourselves and how and why we live the way we do. Everyone worked extra hard and did their very best to recreate beautiful drawings of their own homes. They also had the opportunity to share with the class all about their house and what makes it special to them. ## PreK 2

This month in Pre-K2, we spent most of our time preparing for the art gala. Since our theme was "Around the World," we used this as an opportunity to learn about different places around the world. Over the past few months, many of our Pre-K2 friends have been drawing large portraits of Seattle skyline buildings for fun. It only seemed right to allow them to use the skills they learned throughout that process for our art gala projects. Therefore, the inquiry for our art gala projects focused on different buildings/structures from around the world. Each child made three drafts for both the personal artwork and the collective artwork, so six total. The personal artwork was a drawing of a building that is special to them and the collective artwork was a building/structure from anywhere around the world that they learned about this month. They used colored pencils and oil pastels in different ways throughout their six drafts to try and find out which one they preferred or to use both in their final drafts. They learned a lot about art and different parts of the world and worked really hard to create these special artworks. They're very proud of their final products, and I'm very proud of them! Otherwise, our six-year-old friends have all graduated from kindergarten and are now back at YCA full-time for the summer so we went back to our normal daily schedule. The summer months are typically when we start doing more fun, warm-weather activities. ## Music & Drama Class with Kiki

Hello YCA families!

We spent most of the music and drama class in June learning about different styles of music. I wanted to teach the kids that all the different styles and genres of music that we covered have rhythm in common no matter how different they sound. First, we listened to styles of music like country, hip hop, techno, rock and roll, and heavy metal. We played rhythm sticks to the rhythm of each song. Heavy metal and rock and roll were our top favorites in all the classrooms. □ Next, I chose music from around the world. We listened to traditional music from Brazil, Argentina, Ethiopia, Germany, China, and Japan. We played egg shakers with these songs, and the German Polka got a lot of laughs. We finished the month by writing fairy tales in each class, inspired by a picture of a whimsical house. The kids came up with characters and names, like a monkey named "D'shay-yay" (Nate in P2), a Unicorn named "Shrek" (Keira and Blair in Pk1), and a talking cake named Harold (Etta in Pk2) The stories had plots and battles and resolutions as well. I loved how creative everyone was! The Pk1 and Pk2 kids practically begged me to let them act it out, so naturally, we will be doing that the first Friday of July.

## Japanese with Karlee

We finally finished all of the wild cat books with one about flying an airplane and one about sneaking into an ice cream factory. We practiced our folding skills with paper airplanes and had some ice cream and popsicles on what was one of the coolest days of the month (can you believe it was in the 60s at the beginning of the month!?)

We also learned how to say some body parts (eyes [me], ears [mimi], mouth [kuchi- a favorite in P2], nose [hana], and eyebrows [mayuge]). We played a face-creating game where we said the names of the face parts and put them on the face one by one. Some of the creations were very interesting!

We are looking forward to moving on to summer books starting this month. I wonder what we will learn about.



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
